

Friends of Atascadero Lake October 16, 2018 Board Meeting Minutes

- Approval of the September 1, 2019 Minutes
- Treasurer's Report, Olan Kaigel: Beginning balance of \$30,300.20, deposits of \$202.00, withdrawals of \$1255.31, leaving an ending balance of \$29,247.01. Because the water level is high and the pump costs have been over \$400 per month from last year, Don Lynge made a motion and Bob seconded, to turn off the pump. All approved. (the day after the vote we reconsidered as we did not affect the pedal boat concession by having the lake to low, it was unanimously agreed by email to keep the pump running).
- Lake Perimeter Signage Project, Michelle Harms: Michelle requested a 60% deposit for the first sign costing \$2,205.66. If we did the remaining 9 signs all at once the charge per sign would be \$1650.00 each. The board had decided to complete the first sign to see how it looks and completed installation by the city before we order the remaining signs. This first sign should be completed in 20 days. Bob and Michelle will contact the city for installation.
- Lake Perimeter Clean Up, Nancy Hair: We hope many folks come out to volunteer. We did hear back form the Grizzly Camp and they will be sending out 41 cadets around noon to help us. This is great news as they can do the work of hauling all the trimmings to the dumpsters. We will contact the Grizzlies for ways to thank them. Richard Mason from Sound Off came to the lake an intervened Nancy Hair regarding the cleanup. We really appreciate the airtime and Richards effort in supporting Friends of Atascadero Lake.

- LakeFest 2020, Nancy Hair: After much discussion Don made a motion and Michelle seconded it to leave the May 2020. We will be looking at some other groups to partner with to add to the event.
- Algae Report, Bob Edmonds: Bob did not get a return call from Nick Debar regarding the algae prior to the meeting. The city has been diligent about putting in the product and the lake looks healthy and good. Everyone is enjoying all the fishing going on at the lake also.
- Round Table: The Tamale Festival is January 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. January 17<sup>th</sup> will be a family night, no alcohol. January 18<sup>th</sup> will be the full festival with music, alcohol and of course more tamales. This is a wonderful opportunity for our group to raise funds and we appreciate the city allowing us to participate in this way. So please save the date of January 18<sup>th</sup>, we will be needing volunteers. Don Lynge asked Dick and Wendy Pierce if they would like to become board members and they said they would think about it.
